**INTRODUCTION**

The records reflect that you are a veteran of the Peacetime and Gulf War Era. You served in the Navy from June 11, 1975 to May 22, 1979 and from March 10, 1988 to February 29, 2000. You filed a new claim for benefits that was received on January 1, 2008. Based on a review of the evidence listed below, we have made the following decision on your claim.

**DECISION**

Service connection for sleep apnea (to include symptoms of fatigue, tiredness, irritability and headaches) is denied.

**EVIDENCE**

- Report from Mary Washington Hospital dated August 22, 2007.
- Reports from Stafford Primary Care Associates dated July 19, 2007 to December 27, 2007.

- Service treatment records for the period June 11, 1975 to February 29, 2000.

### **REASONS FOR DECISION**

#### **Service connection for sleep apnea (to include symptoms of fatigue, tiredness, irritability and headaches).**

Service connection may be granted for a disability which began in military service or was caused by some event or experience in service. Service connection for sleep apnea (to include symptoms of fatigue, tiredness, irritability and headaches) is denied since this condition neither occurred in nor was caused by service.

The service treatment records are negative for any findings, treatment or diagnosis of sleep apnea while in service. The service treatment record indicating complaints of fatigue, irritability and headaches are isolated complaints and not probative. The first indication was well after your discharge from military service. Likewise, there is no medical evidence to attribute your sleep apnea to your military service or to any exposure while in service. Given these findings the claim for service connection for sleep apnea must be denied.
