INTRODUCTION

The records reflect that you are a veteran of the Peacetime. You served in the Army from April 24, 1985 to March 15, 1988. You filed a claim for increased evaluation that was received on June 19, 2020. Based on a review of the evidence listed below, we have made the following decision(s) on your claim.

DECISION

Evaluation of migraine headaches, which is currently 0 percent disabling, is increased to 50 percent effective February 27, 2020.

REASONS FOR DECISION

Evaluation of migraine headaches currently evaluated as 0 percent disabling.

The evaluation of migraine headaches is increased to 50 percent disabling effective February 27, 2020. An increase evaluation has been established within 1 year of receipt of the intent to file a claim, VA will consider the complete claim filed as of the date the intent to file a claim was received, if more than a year after discharge from active duty, in accordance with (38 CFR 3.155, 38 CFR 3.400, 38 CFR 4.124a).

We have assigned a 50 percent evaluation for your migraine headaches (also claimed as visual color changes, ocular migraines based on:

• Very frequent completely prostrating and prolonged attacks productive of severe economic inadaptability (38 CFR 4.124a)

Additional symptom(s) include:

• Characteristic prostrating attacks occurring on an average once a month over last several months

This is the highest schedular evaluation allowed tmder the law for migraine. (38 CFR 4.120, 38 CFR4.124a)
